Under the chair.”

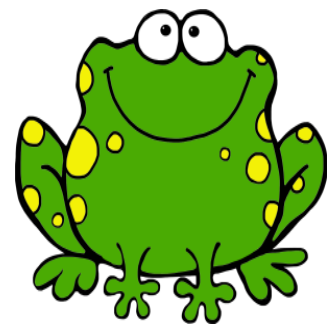
9. TWO LITTLE DICKEY BIRDS

All day long.



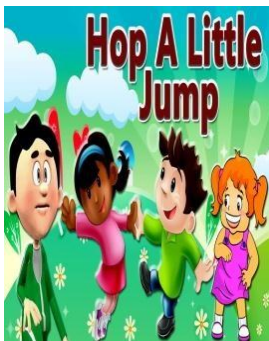
18. ONE, TWO, THREE, FOUR, FIVE

This little finger on my right.



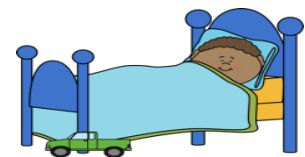
19. TEDDY BEAR, TEDDY BEAR

22. WE ARE GOING TO THE MARKET

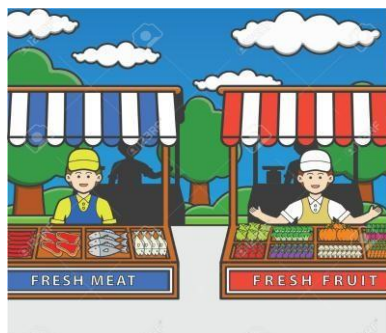
We are going to the market, we are going to the fair,
